Ronit Irshai Bar Ilan University and Shalom Hartman Institute in Jerusalem Progress and Backlash: Israeli Modern-Orthodox Feminism

Ronit Irshai is the head of the gender studies department at Bar Ilan University, and a research fellow at the Shalom Hartman institute in Jerusalem. She has published a series of articles on halakhah (Jewish law), theology and gender, Jewish sexual ethics, and Jewish Modern-Orthodox feminism. Her first book: Fertility and Jewish Law – Feminist Perspectives on Orthodox Responsa Literature was published by Brandeis University Press in 2012. The second book on abortion was recently published in Hebrew by Magness press and the third book on Modern-Orthodox Feminism in Israel (together with Dr. Tanya Zion- Waldoks) will be published by Brandeis University Press.


