The history of Beth Hebrew, a mid-century Phoenix synagogue turned Mexican American Pentecostal church and African American theater, show how meaning are created and re-created in the encounters of different people with this place. The founders of Beth Hebrews saved 1500 Jews from Vichy France. The building epitomizes post-Holocaust Jewish life in the American West as well as struggles with social justice, racial and economic disparities, and community building in a heavily segregated city. Even as a graffiti-covered vacant building, the restored but empty structure expresses the lives of its occupants in ways that can only be understood by different scholars and disciplines in conversation with each other.
